Dear Folks,

As I compose thisSundayletter am sitting on retreat with about twenty-five priests of the diocese. We are staying the wonderful retreat house in White Post, Virginia. The retreat house, San Damiano, sits about thirty minutes from St. Francis De Sales Church. The retreat has served as a lesson on how a priest reviews the providence of God in his service at the altar and among the faithful. More on that in a moment.



Of course, there can be some distractions that effect the soul of the wretched priest on retreat. One poor cleric, behind me, reminded me of a story from St. Therese of the Little Flower. In the case of the French saint was the unnamed religious who would rattle her rosary against the pew as she was lost in her pious devotion. Not so for the future saint of Lisieux caught up in every rattle. The same for me with the hard working cleric, behind me, who with deep breathing, lost to a somber world of sleep... deep sleep. What to do?

So in the next session of the retreat I moved to another seat in the chapel... and so did he. Right behind me. The heavy breathing continued. Life never ends.

Back to the interesting feature of the day. God bless the French. In the seventh century they converted a pagan festival and baptized it as a novel feast day. "Feast of the Ass." Yes, you heard it here first but can find it on Wikipedia for January 14th. In the life of the Lord there are two asses of note. One in the beginning, today's ass, and one at the end... entering Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The great English writer, G.K. Chesterton wrote a poem for the latter and I shall save it for Lent. But today it is the day of the French devotion.

I once delivered a talk to the Knights of Columbus in Northern Virginia, on the Feast of the Ass and commended them to the day as they all carry the Lord to Protect Him as well as carrying Him to present Him to the world. And so I referred to my fellow Knights, in their honorable apostolates as fellow... Asses. They never had me back. Ha! Ha!

Fairplay for the parishioners with French roots. Two great facets have been given to the Church by the Francophiles of old. First, they are the ones who introduced the image of Mary dressed in blue. Reminds me of another poem (found on Wikipedia)... for another time. The French also introduced a quicker cadence to the Latin hymns unlike their cousins on the Italian peninsula, who crawl their melodic devotions. Both schools of melody can be found at St. Francis De Sales Church each Saturday morning, in the closing of adoration. I say, God bless the French.

In studying the life of the Church there is a certain lessons in anthropology that play out in the homilies of the priest. Some would say the homiletic interests of the clergy bespeaks an entity that walks on three legs: Jesus Christ, Catholic Church, and Morality. And so it does through the many years of service.

But alas, a lesson I learned from a retired priest in my first weeks of priesthood... after my ordination. He reminded me that the newly ordained likes to focus on the Gospels. After some years he expands to a focus on the Old Testament or the writings of Paul. But near the end of his life he focuses

on the Psalms. Nearly forty-four years since my time with Fr. Joseph O'Connor, retired from Newark, I think he had it right all along. Yet, there were three dynamics he missed.

First, the influence of Archbishop Fulton Sheen, who, following the catalyst of Humanae Vitae, of Pope Paul VI, modified his talks to include more scripture. The great orator who made a name on Sunday night TV found the secular stories filled with poetry and humor were lacking in the scriptures. As he changed many of the priests changed in their homiletic piorities. The second dynamic was founded on the German Scripture Scholar, Rudolph Bultmann, who admonished all preachers to refrain from any stories of Christ not found in the scriptures. And the Catholics followed. The third dynamic, came after Fr. O'Connor died. It involved the Protestant ministers, later converts to the Catholic Faith, such as Scott Hahn, and John Bergsma, who opened the doors to Patristics. Focus was given on the stories of those who lived in the time of Christ, or their immediate descendants in the first three centuries.

Well there you have it. As priests change in their thoughts so do the parishioners in the pews change in their homes. Nothing like a good old story to charge the hearts and souls in their family lives. Let us pray for one another.

EXCERPTS FROM THE KNIGHTS' SUPREME CHAPLAIN, ARCHBISHOP WILLIAM E. LORI REGARDING THE HOLY FATHER ANNOUNCING THAT 2025 WILL BE A JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE: "What is hope? Is it wishful thinking? Does it rely on optimistic predictions too good to be true? Is it a belief that somehow everything will turn out fine? No, hope is not airy optimism. It does not mean that we will be spared illness, financial hardship, rejection, or even having our worst fears come true. Rather, amid life's joys and sorrows, its aspirations and anxieties, the virtue of hope fixes our gaze upon something that appears at the forefront of our minds and in the depths of our hearts: something so good that it could not be better. Hope is our deepest yearning for that reality, enabling us to receive it and to discover at length that it has a name, a face, an identity: Jesus, the Son of God and the Son of Mary, the One 'who loved us and handed himself over for us' (Eph 5:2). If this is who God is, and if this God is on our side, who and what can be against us? (cf. Rom 8:31). Finally, it is when hope overtakes us that we begin opening doors of hope for others. As the family of the Knights of Columbus, we know something about this. Our first principle is charity, which is the key to hope. When we love, and when we experience love, our hearts are opened. That is why the service we render to the widow, the orphan, and to those in need opens doors of hope every day. In this Holy Year, may you experience the 'hope [that] does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts' (Rom 5:5)."




