



During Lent, denying ourselves food and drink can also help us to make more room in our hearts for one another, for those in need, and ultimately for the Savior, in whose pierced heart is the fullness of redemption.

Lent the McGivney way boils down to this: Charity corresponds to almsgiving; unity to prayer; fraternity to fasting. Guided by the principles that our Founder left us, may we experience our best Lent ever."

1/2 teaspoon of baking soda
1/2 teaspoon of salt
