

Dear Folks,

As we enter the second week of Lent let us be grateful for the Lord and His many blessings offered to each of us and all of our families. May the Faith, for all of us, flourish and with the guiding light of God's eternal love lead our way in the stresses/strains of all our duties. Let us never tire of praying for one another.

Lent is the time to recognize the call to conversion. For those entering the Church their motivations may be the result of many graceful experiences.



It might well be the example of a spouse, in-law, classmate, dorm mate, or roommate. Some may seek the ultimate nourishment of the Eucharist or consolation of the "Box." Their coming is a constant reminder of the ongoing conversion that takes place in our cradle Catholics.

In the penitential season where priests are adorned with purple/violet vestments, reminding us to prepare for the coming Easter with prayer and penance. Fasting helps us to refocus on our vocations and occupations. One leads us to the gates of Heaven and the latter leads us to the town centers of the world.

Almsgiving removes our focus and self and sets it on the needs of others... we will never know, on this side of the Gates of Heaven. And finally prayer, where we reach into the mysteries of God Trinitarian love.

One of the essential components for a letter of recommendation for a candidate for a job, college, or scout award is to recognize the individual is a, "team player." Well in offering the "Our Father," Jesus helps to be a team prayer. In the prayer first introduced at Sermon on the Mount (Mt. 5-7) we are called to avoid babbling. In the prayer we honor God, hope for the coming Kingdom, pledge to forgive others that we may be forgiven, and ask for God's protection in times of temptation. There you have it, we are called to be team prayers. God bless one and all. Let us pray for one another.

Speaking of team prayers. Enclosed are the new modifications for both the Act of Contrition and Absolution from the priest in the Confessional. Nothing earthshaking. With the act of contrition there are now about three or four versions... if you don't want to offer one on the fly. Please join us for nightly confessions during the weeks of Lent as well as the weekend schedule.

ACT OF CONTRITION

"O my God,

I am heartily sorry for having offended you, and I detest all my sins because of your just punishments, but most of all because they offend you, my God, who are all good and deserving of all my love.

I firmly resolve, with the help of your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin.

Amen."

*Penitents are not limited to the options provided in the Order of Penance, and are free to express their sorrow with other prayers or even in their own words
