Adoration will continue until 5pm on Tuesday, Election Day. Please consider taking one of the adoration hours during the night or next day. In the coming week, in response to the recent diocesan plant review the doors of the church will be locked each night at 9pm and those coming later will need the pass care for the electric entrance on the right side of the doors. Let us pray for one another.

On Sunday November 8th, following the 10:30am Mass we will bless the new flagpole. We are also inviting the first responders in the local Police Department, Fire Department, Sheriff's Office, and Emergency Medical responders for the dedication in their honor. We will also remember, in this dedication, the parishioners serving in the military. Many thanks to the Knights of Columbus in this project. Please, come one and all. God bless you and God bless America.

Also, on November 8th, at 7pm, Mr. Michael Galdo will offer an organ recital in the Church. All will start at 7pm. Please come and join us. Also, if you see Mike and lovely wife, Carla, congratulate them on their new addition to the family. Young "Joan."

In case you have not noticed, the lights for the Crux Gloria, Cross at the end of St. Francis Court, adjacent to Rt. 7, have been restored. God bless Mike Corrigan. 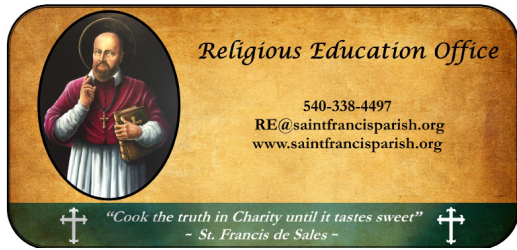

Children Learn about the Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima: Many thanks to the members of the Legion of Mary who gave a presentation to all children in our program about the Pilgrim Virgin Statue displayed in the church during the month of October. *If your family would like to learn more about hosting the Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima for a week, we will have information for you in the lobby of the Education Center during Religious Education classes on Sunday, November 1 and Monday, November 2.* This is a beautiful devotion, and one that all families are welcome to participate in.

Required Waivers: All families who have chosen in-class instruction are required to turn in a participation waiver for each child. If you have not done so, forms are available on the St. Francis website and in the church narthex. By signing this waiver, parents agree to perform a nine-question health screening before each class session. Our re-opening guidelines for parents are also available on the website. We also need a Pick-Up Authorization and Emergency Release Form. We will personally contact each family who is missing this information.

Homeschooling Families: All families who are homeschooling their children this year have been registered for the My Catholic Faith Delivered online materials. If you haven't picked up your books, please email our office and arrange a time to get them. Each child that homeschools will receive a textbook and prayer booklet which outlines prayers to be learned at each of the grade levels.

New Parishioners: If you are new to the parish, or would still like to register your children in one of our programs, please check our website for class details or contact the Religious Education office. We are happy to help! There are still openings in some classes on both Sundays and Mondays; there are openings in the 8th grade class only on Wednesdays.

For those Children who have not received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation: If you would like your children to prepare to receive any of the Sacraments that they might have missed, please contact our office. We are considering opening an RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) class for children on Wednesdays from 4:45 to 6pm. We are happy to talk with you!

There are still openings in our RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Teens) class on Mondays from 6:15 to 7:15. This class is designed for teens who would like to receive the Sacraments or just want to learn more about the Catholic Faith.

Statement of Bishop Burbidge on Pope Francis's Words Regarding "civil unions"

Parishioners of the Diocese of Arlington have shared their concerns and questions regarding reports of the Holy Father's comments in a recent documentary. Contrary to some reports, Pope Francis did not endorse "gay marriage" or in any way change the Church's constant teaching on human sexuality. Marriage is the permanent, exclusive, and fruitful union between one man and one woman. Human sexuality is designed only for the chaste union of man and woman in marriage. These are unchanging and unchangeable truths of the human person known to us by both natural law and divine revelation. The Pope did not and would not teach otherwise. Indeed, he has repeatedly affirmed these truths throughout his pontificate. Again, contrary to how they have been depicted, the Holy Father's comments in a documentary do not constitute a change in the Church's teaching. Nor should any reference to civil unions be understood as the Church accepting homosexual behavior as morally licit. Pope Francis' clear concern is that those with same-sex attractions be treated with respect, compassion, and sensitivity. May we be renewed in our commitment to pray daily for the Holy Father, who bears the extraordinary burden of caring for the universal Church during these difficult times.
