Dear Folks,

Please allow a sober note of concern. Three times in the last three years we have found Sacred Hosts, from Communion at Mass, left in a book, on the floor below a pew people were sitting and broken in multiple pieces and left in the book rack of a pew. The most recent setting for the desecration of a host took place in the eighth pew, on the St. Joseph side of the pews. In this case location is not everything. We don't know if the host was received by a Catholic and came from



a recent Mass, or possibly a non-Catholic who attended a distant liturgical event like a wedding or funeral. In the first case there may have been malice and ignorance in the second case. It all falls back upon our firm conviction as Catholics... the host is the true body of Christ, body and blood, soul and divinity. Let us pray we never forget that and treat the Lord with utmost respect and devotion.

We are back to the annual Bishop Lenten Appeal, BLA. I have yet to notice what our parish goal is but I am sure it will be a pretty penny. I heartily encourage all our families to give to the collection. I will offer more on the subject in a coming parish letter. I am drawn back to my memories with Fr. Bertrand DeMargerie SJ when I served as his altar server. It is so important for the priest, in persona Christi, to know how to beg. An essential attribute to Christ who shows how He came to serve and not be served. I beg one and all to please be generous to this most important collection.

Speaking of begging. Lent is coming soon and we will start off with our annual parish Forty Hours Devotion. Fr. William Kuchinsky, administrator of St. Peter's Catholic church in Harper's Ferry will direct our Forty Hours devotions this year. It will start on Sunday February 19th, at 7:00 PM, following the 5:30 PM Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be set on the altar for the next two days. Services will take place Monday and Tuesday Nights at 7:00 PM. A sign-up sheet will be placed in the front Fourier of the church for each family to pick an hour..

The origin of Forty Hours came around a thousand years ago with the threats imposed on the walled in city of Milan, Italy. An invading army threatened to to attack so the Blessed Sacrament was placed on the altar for Forty Hours, representing the darkest hours in history when Christ was set in the Tomb. As we do not pray for from protection from outside invaders we pray the Lord to protect us from threats within our hearts and souls. Let us please pray for one another.

Heads up, as Lent comes with Ash Wednesday we will reintroduce Evening Confessions during the weekdays at 7:00 PM. On Wednesday the Confessions will be at 8:00 PM, following the weekly 7:00 holy hour. True to form, in honor of the Redemptorists who used to lead our local parishes in prayers and devotions they would remind us they would give ten dollars to anyone who could tell them a sin they have never heard before. Hmmm? Please bring yourselves to the box.

And lastly, you will notice a new emergency door is being set up at the front of the church. It won't be long now.
