

Dear Folks,

Welcome to the first Sunday of Lent. How quickly the liturgical seasons have passed. In this season of prayer and penance in preparation for the coming of Easter let us draw together in our prayers and encouragement for each other. The younsters recently celebrated their First Penance and now move on to their coming First Communion. The confirmation class steps forward to Confirmation, with Archbishop Timothy Broglio, of the Military Ordinariate. But



first, the challenge of the Confirmation interviews.

The Confirmation Interviews involve the parents joining the student for a review of their sacramental preparation for Confirmation. Quite simply, the interview involves the details of the "Religion Clock." The clock is a catechetical survey of basic Catholic principles. One: One God. Two: Two Natures of Christ. Three: Three theological virtues. Four: Four Gospel writers. And so on to the number 12. The kids will be asked their confirmation names and say something about their choice of name for Confirmation. The student will also be asked to say the, "Act of Contrition." The parents will also be asked to say the same prayer. God bless them all. Talk about stress... for the parents.

During Lent evening confessions will take place during the weekdays. On Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday we will have confessions at 7:00 pm. Confessions will follow the weekly holy hour on Wednesday night. And confessions will follow the 7:30 Stations of the Cross on Friday night. As Bishop Burbidge says, "Come on down. We will leave the light on."

I want to thank the folks who joined us for the recent Forty Hours Devotions. I found a number of our youth group members at the 1:00 am Hour. I told them I would write each of them great letters of recommendation for their collegiate applications. The second night I found a Knight of Columbus and his wife who joined us at the one o'clock hour... and he with a heart issue requiring surgery in another ten days. That one had me worried. I told them both they should be home in bed resting up. But, no they were there for the hard hour. God bless them.

Many thanks goes out to the wonderful ladies of the Women's Group in setting up for the Shrove Tuesday... spaghetti supper. Such a wonderful group of ladies. One followed up with designs on a new food garden to take place on the site of the property just off the parking lot. She is hoping they make some of the produce for Sunday morning Mass and additional will go off to sources for needy families. Please stay tuned. The original parish garden was named for St. Isidore the farmer. You know, for those who are outstanding in their fields... that was a joke. The second garden was named for Mother Teresa. I have yet to hear of the new name but will get back to you on that one. Please stay tuned as I am sure the group will welcome all the help they can get on the garden.

LENTEN MESSAGE: Archbishop William E. Lori is the Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus. His "Supreme Chaplain's Column" in the January/February 2023 edition of the (Knights of Columbus) Columbia Magazine, he wrote about "the Order's principles to help us to better understand and practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving."

"Lent, a season both joyful and sober, is meant for every member of the Church, but I believe that Blessed Michael McGivney can give us a helping hand in our Lenten self-denial and spiritual growth. The help he offers is embedded in the very principles of charity, unity and fraternity upon which he built the Knights of Columbus.

Let's begin with our first principle, charity. If we are to open our hearts to the crucified Shepherd who loves us like no other, our hearts must be aflame with charity. The Church's tradition, therefore, identifies almsgiving as a most beneficial Lenten practice. It is easy to see an equivalence between charity and almsgiving, which is more than providing financial help to the needy, important as that is. Almsgiving refers to all forms of charitable outreach to those who are in need — precisely the outreach we engage in as Knights. Whether it's Coats for Kids, the heroic service of Knights to Ukrainian refugees, disaster relief, or simply helping a neighbor in time of trouble — all these are ways of putting the needs of others ahead of our own. Through charity, we become more like Christ, who gave himself up for us and for our salvation."




