GUIDELINES FOR GODPARENTS AND CHRISTIAN WITNESSES FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

For the Sacrament of Baptism, a child preferably has two Catholic Godparents, who practice the faith and are active in their parish. However, only one Godparent is necessary. When there is only one Godparent, a Christian Witness may also be present; a Christian Witness is not a Catholic, but an active member of another Christian Church. To be a Catholic Godparent, a person must

- 1. be at least 16 years old,
- 2. have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation in the Catholic Church,
- 3. if married, be validly married in the Catholic Church, and
- 4. attend Mass regularly on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, receive the Sacraments of the Church regularly, and profess the teachings of the Catholic Church.

To be a Christian Witness, a person must

- 1. be at least 16 years old,
- 2. have received the Sacrament of Baptism, and
- 3. worship at Church regularly on Sundays and be active in the Christian community.

Please note that a Catholic who is not eligible to be a Godparent for whatever reason may not be a Christian Witness. <u>Also, a person who was baptized and raised as a Catholic,</u> <u>but has chosen to leave the Catholic Church and has joined another Christian Church,</u> <u>may not stand as a Christian Witness at a Catholic Baptism.</u>
