Dear Folks,

As mentioned in my recent homilies I am very much interested in reactivating the parish Legion of Mary for several reasons. Parishes promoting the Marian devotions enjoy many graces in vocations, as well as health and sacramental longevity. There is nothing new in that. The Blessed Mother at Fatima in 1917, called us to be atten-



tive to the coming of a great Apostasy to the Church (Third Secret of Fatima) and to secure ourselves from that inevitability we need to promote a devotion to Christ in the Eucharist, Christ in His sacraments (notably, Penance), and a devotion Mary and all the Saints.

As a parish we are doing a great job, and are improving in many ways thru the first two admonishments but we are lagging in the third, with our devotion to Mary and the Saints. So, we seek to reestablish our apostolate to Mary in the Legion.

Starting next Sunday, a table will be set out for a rosary donation/exchange. If you have rosaries sitting unused in drawers or on bookshelves, baskets, or cupboards please bring them in that someone else might use them. If you need a rosary, please take one for yourself and one for each of the members of the family who would like one. Please give a rosary to your collegians. Like all sacramentals, the rosary fosters hope in our daily life. If you have broken rosaries that are beyond hope than leave them with me and I will bury them on Sacred Ground.

That said, I encourage all couples and families of St. Francis De Sales to initiate a nightly rosary... or decade of the rosary for the graces of God to safeguard their homes and our parish. Simplicity, Simplicity, Simplicity needs to be our mantra. The second mantra, more and admonishment, is: "If you are good to people in need people will be good to you when you are in need."

In closing, we don't expect to reactivate the Legion of Mary until around the coming October, the Month dedicated to the Rosary. Please stay tuned.

Let all have a great Summer. And, please bring me some of the parish bulletins you might pick up when you are away. We are not afraid to steal a few good ideas. They are the spice of life. God bless one and all.

Let us pray for each other.

The Knights' services, the Supreme Knight said, will be offered "regardless of creed." The Order provided rest and recreational facilities and social services to Allied servicemen of all faiths. KofC Huts throughout the United States and Europe provided religious services, supplies, and recreation under the motto, "Everybody Welcome, Everything Free."

Everybody meant everybody. Whatever your race or creed, you were welcome at K of C facilities. In fact, the Order was praised by a contemporary African American historian of World War I, because "unlike the other social welfare organizations operating in the war, it never drew the color line."

As a result of the Order's wartime work, the Order earned high praise from Pope Benedict XV.
