

We are immensely grateful to you for giving us the opportunity to serve the teens, the adult volunteers, and the entire parish as Stakeholders for Work Camp 2023. We were challenged by this role, and grew so much through the process of preparing our Work Camp team for this incredible week. We left St. Francis de Sales last Saturday with 24 teens and 9 adult crew leaders. We were truly humbled to witness the Lord work in their hearts this week, and to see them transformed by their encounters with Christ in so many ways (as you have heard recounted at the Masses this weekend). It has been a great joy to hear their heart's reflections, their daily observations, and their amazing aspirations to bring their renewed faith into their daily lives back home.

So many other adults - parishioners, contractors, security personnel, Homebase volunteers, and even members of the Diocesan Work Camp team itself -complimented many of our youth on their preparedness, their countenance, their attitudes, and their maturity. We also heard from many SFDS adults how impressed they were with the entire process the diocesan team put on, from the logistics to the detailed project instructions to the site coordination to Adoration with the Bishop to confession with more than 50 priests to the talk by China Briceno to the group rosary for everyone's intentions to the amazing ways the camp is designed to foster relationship - with Christ first and foremost and with our neighbor right after that. Additionally, we heard from several of the diocesan staff how impressed they were with the SFDS presence at Work Camp - not only in the number of youth and Adult Crew Leaders our parish sent, but also in the number of other volunteers who showed up ready and willing to joyfully serve as part of the Work Camp efforts.


