
<u>Matrimony</u>: Parish couples planning to be married must make arrangements with the Office at least six months prior to the intended date of marriage.

Dear Folks,

Happy Mother's Day to all the mothers, grandmothers, godmothers, expectant mothers, and adopted mothers of the parish. As all are called to be reflections of God in their creative, redemptive, and sanctifying tenets of life they are also called to be models of Blessed Mother. In the Marian example may they be reflective, responsive, and respectful of the facets of God's love, mentioned above. As in the life of Mary, they serve as bridges to the eternal life for all us. How appropriate Mother's Day rises from a secular history in the Month of the Blessed Mother.



On this day I am reminded of the prayer that Archbishop Sheen helped to popularize, "Lovely Lady Dressed in Blue," by Fr. W. Terrence C. Sehl. catholicanada.com/prayers/lovely-lady-dressed-in-blue/

Lovely Lady, Dressed in Blue

Lovely Lady dressed in blue — Teach me how to pray!
God was just your little boy, Tell me what to say!
Did you lift Him up, sometimes, Gently on your knee?
Did you sing to Him the way Mother does to me?
Did you hold His hand at night? Did you ever try
Telling stories of the world? O! And did He cry?
Do you really think He cares If I tell Him thingsLittle things that happen? And
Do the Angels' wings Make a noise?
And can He hear me if I speak low?
Does He understand me now?
Tell me — for you know?
Lovely Lady dressed in blue — Teach me how to pray!
God was just your little boy, And you know the way.

With this day the parish marks the end of the CCD Year of Religious instruction. Please understand that the world of the CCD programs were expanded, not created by the Catalyst of Humanae Vitae. I qualify that statement with a historical marker. In 1972 the Catholic Church made abruptly aware how the rich moral underpinning of the Church was being eroded by both contraception and, soon to follow, abortion. As in all cases where Morality takes a hit Faith is soon to follow. Fr. John Hardon, SJ, was one of the first to focus on catechetics as an evangelical/apostolic work for he knew and could see the future challenges to the faithful of the Church.

And lastly, on this subject, I truly believe Fr. Hardon could see the disastrous arrival of the "Contraceptive Mentality," whereby we, today, are tempted with the thought of creating all things in our own image, and if not successful in that endeavor, killing those things that do not fit our image. A mentality that can pervade all levels of clerics and laity. God bless our wonderful catechists who help to inform the minds of the young in faith and morals. For they are the ones who will touch the hearts of their families and friends, both in the Church and beyond. God bless our wonderful teachers. In closing, as I write this letter on my anniversary to priesthood I offer the final questions both I and Fr. Heisler, on his anniversary, May 15th, were asked before our ordinations. Please pray for the young ones of the parish who may one day follow in our vocations.

Together, all the elect answer:

Bishop: Do you resolve to exercise the ministry of the word worthily and wisely, preaching the Gospel and teaching the Catholic faith?

Elect: I do.

Bishop: Do you resolve to celebrate faithfully and reverently, in accord with the Church's tradition, the mysteries of Christ, especially the sacrifice of the Eucharist and the sacrament of Reconciliation, for the glory of God and the sanctification of the Christian people?

Elect: I do.

Bishop: Do you resolve to implore with us God's mercy upon the people entrusted to your care by observing the command to pray without ceasing?

Elect: I do.

Bishop: Do you resolve to be united more closely every day to Christ the High Priest, who offered himself for us to the Father as a pure sacrifice, and with him to consecrate yourselves to God for the salvation of all?

Elect: I do, with the help of God.

Then each one of the elect goes to the Bishop and, kneeling before him, places his joined hands between those of the Bishop.

If the Bishop is the elect's own Ordinary, he asks: Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my successors?

Elect: I do.

The Bishop always concludes: May God who has begun the good work in you bring it to fulfillment.
