Dear Folks,

Alas the news is flying by fast and furious. Hold on to your pews. Summer is about to slam into our little home in the hills of Loudoun County and we hardly seem aware of the coming sacramental needs of the parish. With the Summer vacations come the vacancies of those most serious souls who serve as Readers at Mass and Special Ministers of Holy Communion at Mass. First, please join those folks involved in giving out Communion at Mass. Janice Rees (i.rees@



stfrancis parish.org). Secondly, please join us for the Eucharistic Adoration Hours on Friday morning until Saturday morning. If interested in a certain hour please contact Mrs. Emily Lauderback (lauderbacks@gmail.com) and she will set you in the calendar. It would be nice to have three to four people cover an hour of adoration. Thank you so very very much. God bless one and all.

You will notice the road sign just before the entrance to the Church. The county, starting May 30th and continuing until June 8th will close the road to one lane. Be prepared for long delays as the workers replace a defective drainage pipe. The highway improvement may be set to prepare the coming of multiple homes across from the rectory. Please stay tuned... I have not informed the favorite dog yet. I am sure he will be traumatized.

I received a call last evening from Fr. Michae Isenberg, Diocesan Vocation Director, asking if we would please take a seminarian this summer. I assured him the parish would be delighted to have a seminarian join us. The student is a second theologian from Mt. St. Mary's Seminary (Emmitsburg, MD). He hails from Cameroon. And that is where the story gets interesting. The three seminarians in Cameroon are here, avoiding the Islamic persecutions in their home country. They will be ordained in Arlington in a few years and than stay with us for four years before returning home to Cameroon. I leave you with some of the details on our coming student.

John Fimmuchime - Theology II - Mount St. Mary's Seminary/ Saint John Paul II Major Seminary Bachuo Ntai Mamfe-Cameroon St. Louis Parish/Diocese of Kumbo, Cameroon

What did you do prior to entering seminary? I entered seminary after high school

What influenced your decision to apply for seminary entrance? I would say that the death of my mother when I was 2 years old is the root of my call to be a priest. There is no other explanation for the call that continues to inspire me to join the Catholic priesthood, which I trace back to the time of her death. My mother died when I was a child, and still today I cannot picture her face; I have no photo of her, I only know that I had a mother who passed away.

In the year 2005, all of my siblings left home; some went in search of jobs, while others went to live with the older ones who were already married. I was left alone with my father. During elementary school, I worked on my late mother's farm, I cooked for my father and myself, and I did most of the housework, so I pretty much say I learned to live alone at age 12. At one point I began to think that the fact that I am alive can only be explained by God's love for me, and that serving in the Church and as a priest would be the best thing I could do for God; I only wanted a place where I could give my life completely to God. Soon after completing my GCE/AL exams (high school) I shared this with my father. He told me, "John, if you want to become a priest, you will need to sponsor yourself." My father gave me 500 francs, which is about \$1. Little did I know these would be my father's final words and care for me, as he died a week later. With his death, my zeal for the Catholic priesthood

only increased. I was very determined to become a priest to respond to all that God has been teaching me in my life. I saw the need to care for the broken-hearted and to thank God for my life through the services I may offer to His people as a priest.

Why do you want to be a priest? To serve God freely as a symbol of my gratitude to Him.

What are your favorite pastimes? Spending time in church, gardening, encouraging my best friend in the spiritual life and sharing knowledge with classmates.

What is your favorite quote? Isaiah 49:23 "Those who hope in me will not be disappointed."

Who is your favorite Saint and why? St. John the Baptist. I am moved by his life history especially his humility. I wish to live such a life.

What advice would you give to a young man thinking about the seminary? The seminary is for all who are from the world and are ready to say no to the things of the world.

Any other interesting facts about yourself? I worked for six months at a radio station and was given a certificate of recognition. I worked as a miller during high school. I have a friend who has always been there to support me on my journey to the priesthood and I consider this as a gift.

Some of you will surely remember Fr. Eugene, of Cameroon, who has visited St. Francis De Sales several times. He visited just last year. He himself has been attacked/kidnapped in his parish assignment at home. I leave you an update on the persecutions of Catholics in Cameroon. Mrs. Leslie Sheldon and her hearty band of seniors from the Young at Heart Group pulled me along for their recent pilgrimage to St. Mary's Basilica in Old Town Alexandria last week. It was a lot of fun visiting one of the eight parishes named for the Blessed Mother. It is quite the place to see. It makes for quite a story. My favorite is where George Washington offered a personal donation to the construction of the church. He was very close to the Jesuits who staffed both the parish and Georgetown University. His aide de camp was a member of the parish.

Next month we will go off to Our Lady of the Valley in Luray and stop at the new chapel at Christendom College. Many years ago, in another century, I was the administrator of Our Lady of the Valley when Fr. Gene Neyer suddenly passed away. The valley church design was set for four different country churches... they each came in pieces from Sears. More on that in another time.

The other night I had the greatest time watching the Trail Life Boys have their annual awards dinner. It is was a big crowd and it was a happy crowd. As we are so proud of the kids and their projects we are so very proud of the parents who together seemed like kids in a sandbox... playing and playing, and playing. A happy, healthy, and holy setting for all to share. Well done.

A few days later I was at the Frakes Farm, along Snickersville Road, with the American Heritage Girls in their campout... in what seemed like a monsoon. A rainstorm, next to a flowing creek only a golden retriever could love. I said mass under the tent while parents and kids stood out in the driving rain. I could not help but think of the troops from the Civil War who could have bivouacked in the same area over a hundred years ago, also in the rain. My hat goes off the girls and their parents. There must be some kind of award for what they endured.

The annual parish talent show was a hoot. God bless the Womens Council and Knights of Columbus for sponsoring the event. Where would we be without the enthusiasm generated with the Women and Knights. They are the best. Next year we will shoot for a February Show, a slower time in the year. Please get yourselves ready.

The SPRED program invites those with disabilities to come together in a small faith community to discover God's presence in their lives and to receive the Sacraments of Initiation, based on individual levels of readiness. Children with Down Syndrome, Autism, and Learning Disabilities are welcome to join this group!

The program meets for 12 sessions on Saturday mornings (10 AM- 12 PM) throughout the year from September – April.
