Dear Folks,

On this beautiful Monday afternoon in the final week of April I am sitting in the hotel settings of Ski Liberty Conference Center, near Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Each year the bishop calls the priests to a convocation on a topic of interest impacting our parochial services to or families. I am with the first half of the collection of priests who are here on Monday thru Wednesday morning and Fr. Heisler comes on the back end of the week, Wednesday afternoon thru Friday.



Bishop Burbidge stopped by to say he had a wonderful time with our Confirmation kids last week and how he was edified with their responses to his catechetical questions. Bishop Loverde ask how Fr. Heisler is doing. They were stationed together in the past. I told him that Father is doing great and we anticipate a big turnout for his surprise 25th anniversary party on May 19th.

Fr. Cregan was asking for several of the families from the parish of which he offered some fond memories for them and all the parish. I told him he was so popular that folks are naming kids after him and if we get another building we may also name it after him. Bishop Loverde offered a big smile over that comment.

Speaking of Fr. Heisler's surprise anniversary Mass on May 19th, I should also mention it is the 40th anniversary for our Holy Deacon, Larry Hammell. Ad Multos Annos to the two of them... To Many Year (past and future).

Two of the priests at the meetings came up earlier today. One thanked me for the letter to his dear mother. I couldn't recall the correspondence but did recall the family response to his ordination... it was not well received In fact his father gave him a beating when he became a Catholic was greatly chagrined when he became of Catholic priest. Harsh times, so many years ago, gave us an amazing priest in todays world. Well, back to the letter, seems the young priest received a very difficult assignment on his first ventures in priestly life. I wrote to the mother saying, despite the difficult assignment, I thought he was well up to the challenges. She kept the letter in her box of favorite correspondence and forgot to mention it to her priest son. He was greatly touched upon her death when he discovered the letter. Nothing like a letter to the good mother.

Back to his parents. Neither became Catholics... but several siblings did. And, wait for it, wait for it... both spent their final years in the Catholic nursing home with good religious taking care of them. Now that is a happy ending.

Another priest reiterated the story of his mother on her death bed. I told her where the diocese would send him in his first priest assignment but she could only tell her husband. Like the seal of confession. The father would tell the son, of the secret, at his mother's funeral. Note well, I did the same for mother of our own, Fr. Michael Kelly.

Just a heads up. We will have a parish excursion to Pittsburg in June to visit one of the world's great collection of relics. More information coming.

What's Growing? We already have plants poking their heads out of the ground and our volunteers are hard at work getting our fence up to protect them. Feel free to visit the garden and be sure to keep your little ones from stepping in the planted beds.

MTGarden Tip: There are many ways to protect your garden with fencing techniques. Ours will be 7' tall to keep the deer from jumping over; we bury 2' of wire underground to keep the rabbits and groundhogs from digging under; and we lay rat wire on the bottom of our raised beds to keep the voles and moles from coming up and reaching the produce.


Catholic Lending Library
